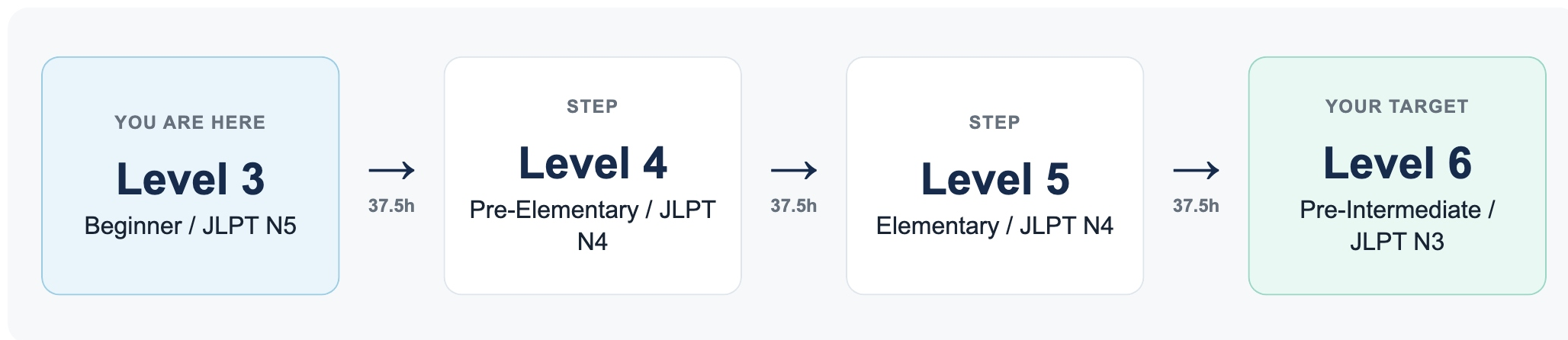


YOUR PERSONALIZED JAPANESE LEARNING ROADMAP

Primary Goal: Improve My Japanese Conversation

Your 6-Level Japanese Learning Scale

See where you are now and where your target sits on the full learning path.

Level	Approx. Japanese Level	What You Can Do with Japanese
Level 1	Complete Beginner	Introduce yourself and use basic greetings. You can say your name, nationality, and simple phrases such as “Nice to meet you,” “Thank you,” and “Excuse me.”
Level 2	Pre-Beginner / JLPT N5	Talk simply about yourself and your everyday life. You can talk about your family, hobbies, likes and dislikes, and describe a simple daily routine.
Level 3 YOU ARE HERE	Beginner / JLPT N5	Handle simple everyday interactions. You can order food, shop, ask for directions, ask and answer simple questions, and make basic plans with someone.
Level 4	Pre-Elementary / JLPT N4	Handle more everyday situations in Japanese. You can explain what you need, ask for help, talk about familiar topics, and have short conversations while living or traveling in Japan.
Level 5	Elementary / JLPT N4	Keep conversations going and express yourself more clearly. You can talk about past experiences and future plans, explain your preferences and reasons, and communicate in many everyday situations.
Level 6 YOUR TARGET	Pre-Intermediate / JLPT N3	Communicate more independently in Japanese. You can explain your thoughts and experiences in more detail, handle longer conversations, and communicate in a wider range of everyday, study, and work situations.

JLPT levels are approximate references. Conversation ability and JLPT proficiency may differ.
